IPRA 40th Anniversary and 20th Conference London (1964) Groningen (1965)

- 1964: London: IPRA was founded
- 1965: 1st IPRA Conference in Groningen
- First Executive Committee: Röling (NL), Galtung (N), de Reuck (UK), Acomovich (Yu), Sawicki (Poland)
- 1977: 7th IPRA Conference in Mexico (first attendance)
- 1986: 11th IPRA Conference in Sussex: Founding of Commission: Weapons Technology & Disarmament
- Co-founders: H.G.Brauch, C.Mesjasz, P.Dunay, S.Tachibana
- Result: 1989: Macmillan Book: Military Technology Armaments Dynamics and Disarmament, with a preface by Lord Solly Zuckerman, former science adviser to UK PM Wilson
- 1991-1997: IPRA Defence and Disarmament Study Group Paper 1-9 [http://www.afes-press-books.de/html/ap_reports.htm]

1986, Univ. of Sussex: IPRA Commission on Weapons Technology and Disarmament, now: Security and Disarmament

- 1985: IPRA SG: Chad Alger suggested new Com.,
 (I submitted a paper that did not fit into any commission)
- 13-16.4.1986: Establishment of the IPRA Weapons Technology & Disarmament Commission
- Context: Second Cold War: Reagan Rearmament Programme: Neutron bombs, binaries & SDI Biggest Commission: 32 papers: Discussion with the late Sanaa Osseiran on Middle East conflict
- Week of US reprisal against Libya after attack on bar La Belle in (West) Berlin where 3 Gls died

Impact of Ideas on Global Change: End of Cold War of 1989/1990

- 1980: Mary Kaldor, U. Albrecht: European Nuclear Disarmament (END) Movement: disarmament & human rights
- 1980s: Thinking on defence alternatives: non-offensive defence, confidence building measures: defence of the homeland without destroying it (Lessons from Weizsäcker, 1972)
- 1986: ISA in St. Louis: Session on defence alternatives: A. Arbatov, A, Karkoska et al. (Gorbachev)
- Gorbachev proposals: CBMs, military doctrine etc.
- 1988: AFES-PRESS, Mosbach: Dialogue on military doctrine: Americans, Russians, German & Polish diplomats
- 1990: 2st CSCE (OSCE) Seminar on military doctrine
- What was instrumental: US military superiority or Garthoff, Evangelista, Risse: Ideas mattered for the turn of 1989.

- 1998: Durban: Bullens Tachibana
- 2000: Tampere: Bullens Tachibana
- 2002: Söul: Reynolds
- 2004: Sopron: Reynolds

Contextual Change: 1986 to 2004

- 1986: symmetric, bipolar system, nuclear deterrence theory, weapons buildup of Reagan Administration (neutron bomb, binaries, SDI, etc.)
- Peace Research: thinking on conceptual alternatives: breaking out of orthodoxy, reference object: peace movements and decision makers (to learn)
- Independent Peace Movement: dual criticism of military build-up in East and West and of human rights violations in the East
- Poland 1980 (Solidarnosc), 27 June 1989 (Hungary: cutting of the Iron Wire, 4 June 1989: first indep. election in Poland,9 Nov. Berlin Wall fell)
- 1 May 2004: 15 years later: Hungary, Poland + 8 other countries in EU.
- Assessment depends on your mindset and world view (macro theory)
- My Grotian thesis: Ideas mattered, they influenced peace movements in the West but also Michail Gorbachev's advisers who looked for ways to break out of the security dilemma by conceptual innovation to reduce the arms costs.
- Hobbesian thesis: Military superiority won Cold War (Anderson: Victory).
- Both Hobbesian (victory) and Kantian (peace dividend) perspectives failed to offer proper diagnoses and remedies of the Post Cold War period.
- Task: To look for policy relevant conceptual alternatives.
- This is the background for my own pragmatic Grotian perspective.

New Context: End of Bipolarity, Reunification of Europe and New Security Challenges

- 18 years after Sussex: political miracles have occurred!
- With fall of Berlin Wall: first Germany, then Europe moved towards unification after centuries of conflicts, solved our security dilemma!
- During 1980s: goals of European Nuclear Disarmament (END) movement for "disarmament" and "human rights" have become reality
- **∠** Success: Pershing and SS-20 are in museums in Moscow & Washington
- Chemical weapons are being destroyed (by 2012) & SDI was never built so far!
- **∠** Our call for a confidence-building defence structure became reality in Europe.
- New Challenges of 1990s: disintegration, ethnic conflicts unforeseen!
- New Challenges after 2001: terrorist challenge & response & improper legitimation of Iraq war against so-called rogues.
- New Environmental Challenges to survival due to climate change, desertification and water scarcity (supply side) while demand for resources increases. Population growth, urbanisation, food security.

Towards a New Peace Research Agenda

- Review old Peace Research Agenda: Peace & Security
- Has there been a basic change in the thinking of security since 1990 or 2001 with regard to referents & threats (challenges etc.)?
- What are new security threats, challenges, vulnerabilities, risks?
- What are the referents of the analysis: "state" or "human beings"?
- New Tasks for Peace Research: New Human & Environmental Security Challenges: AFES-PRESS & own research agenda:


