**H.E. Dr. Kamel S. Abu Jaber** (Jordan) is currently President of the Higher Media Council of Jordan, formerly President of the Jordan Institute of Diplomacy (since 1997). He served as a Senator in the Jordan Upper House of Parliament (1993-1997) and as Minister of Foreign Affairs for Jordan (1991-1993), during which period he led the Jordanian and Palestinian delegation in the opening round of the Middle East peace talks in Madrid, and as Minister of the Economy (1973). In his academic work, he held the posts of Professor of Political Science (1971, 1979-1980, 1985), Dean of the Faculty of Economics and Commerce (1972-1979) and Director of the Strategic Studies Centre at the University of Jordan; he also served as Associate Professor of Political Science at Smith College, U.S.A. (1967-1969) and as Visiting Professor at Emory University, the Carter Centre in Atlanta, U.S.A. (1989). Dr. Abu Jaber holds a doctorate degree in Political Science (1965) from the University of Syracuse (U.S.A.) and has carried out research in Oriental Studies (1962-1963) at Princeton University (U.S.A.). He is the author of numerous papers and publications, including *The Palestinians: People of the Olive Tree* (1993), *Political Parties and Elections in Israel* (1985), *Economic Potentialities of Jordan* (1984), *The Israeli Political System* (1973), *The United States of America and Israel* (1971) and *The Arab Ba'ath Socialist Party* (1966).

**Jonathan Dean** (United States of America): Adviser on International Security Issues, Union of Concerned Scientists, one of the largest public interest organisations in the United States working on questions of environmental and international security. A former ambassador, he joined the U.S. Foreign Service in 1949 after combat infantry service in Europe in World War II. In the Foreign Service, he worked mainly on issues of East-West relations, disarmament, and international peacekeeping. He is the author of *Watershed in Europe* (1987), *Meeting Gorbachev's Challenge* (1989), *Ending Europe's Wars* (1994), and co-author of *The Nuclear Turning Point* (Brookings 1999).

**Sir Crispin Tickell GCMG KCVO** (United Kingdom): is Chancellor of the University of Kent at Canterbury; Chairman of the Climate Institute of Washington D.C.; Chairman of the Advisory Board of the Earth Centre in South Yorkshire; and Chairman of the Advisory Committee on

the Environment (ACE) of the International Council for Science. Currently he is a Senior Visiting Fellow at the Harvard University Center for the Environment. Most of his career was in the Diplomatic Service. He was Chef de Cabinet to the President of the European Commission (1977-80), Ambassador to Mexico (1981-83), Permanent Secretary of the Overseas Development Administration (1984-87), and British Permanent Representative to the United Nations (1987-90). He then became Warden of Green College, Oxford (1990-97), and remains Director of the Green College Centre for Environmental Policy and Understanding. He was President of the Royal Geographical Society (1990-93); Chairman of the International Institute for Environment and Development (1990-94); Chairman of the Government's Advisory Committee on the Darwin Initiative (1992-99); President of the National Society for Clean Air (1997-99); Convenor of the Government Panel on Sustainable Development (1994-2000); and a Trustee of the Natural History Museum (1992-2001). He is author of *Climate Change and World Affairs* (1977 and 1986), and *Mary Anning of Lyme Regis* (1996). He has contributed to many books on environmental issues (including human population increase and biodiversity). He was a member of two Government Task Forces: one on Urban Regeneration, and the other on Near Earth Objects. His interests go very wide: they range from business and charities to climate, mountains, pre-Columbian art, and the early history of the Earth.
